





#### Alamo WDA

The Alamo WDA's labor force decreased in the month of December by 1,510. The unemployment rate dropped three-tenths of a percentage point to 4.3 percent. A year ago, the Alamo WDA's unemployment rate stood at 5.2 percent, six-tenths of a percentage point below the state rate of 5.8 percent. The number of employed residents rose by 2,039 over the month, and the number of unemployed fell by 3,549. The counties driving the decrease in the unemployment rate are Bexar and Kerr, combining for the majority of employment gain in the WDA. The number of unemployed normally declines during the month of December, while employment normally rises. Claims for unemployment benefits in the WDA dropped by 907 over the month.









#### **Brazos Valley WDA**

Employment in the Brazos Valley WDA decreased eight-tenths of a percentage point in December 2005. Of the seven counties, Brazos County had the largest over-the-month decrease in employment with a reduction of 655 workers, followed by Grimes County with a reduction of 169 workers. Unemployment in the Brazos Valley WDA decreased by 9.5 percent. Brazos Valley WDA's unemployment rate decreased by three-tenths of a percentage point over the month. Brazos County had the lowest unemployment rate in this WDA at 3.6 percent. Grimes County had the highest unemployment rate at 5.6 percent. Continued claims increased by 16.3 percent.

#### **Cameron County WDA**

The civilian labor force in the Cameron County WDA increased slightly in December to 146,748 people. Cameron County's labor force is comprised of 137,645 workers and 9,103 job seekers. The unemployment rate decreased three-tenths of a percentage point in the WDA over the month. Since January 2005, the rate has dropped 2.8 percent and tied with October's rate of 6.2 as the lowest for this year. The unemployment rate stood at 8.7 percent a year ago. Employment in the WDA slightly increased by 678 workers over the month, or 0.5 percent while the number of unemployed decreased by 411, or 4.3 percent. The number of continued claims for the week of the twelfth decreased over the month, posting at 1,795. Since January 2005, the number of continued claims has dropped by 5.089.


#### **Capital Area WDA**

Capital Area's labor force decreased in December by 3,718. The unemployment rate dropped three-tenths of a percentage point to 4.0 percent. The unemployment rate stood at 4.8 percent a year ago compared to the state rate of 5.8 percent. Over the month, the number of employed Capital Area workers declined by 1,714 and the number of unemployed also decreased by 2,004. Total initial claims for unemployment benefits in the WDA increased over the month to 2,248. The total number of continued claimants for December in Travis County totaled 16,958, a increase of 2,020 over the month. 





#### **Central Texas WDA**

Central Texas WDA's labor force decreased by 792. The unemployment rate dropped by three-tenths of a percentage point to 4.9 percent in December. The unemployment rate has lingered at or below 5.2 percent since July 2005. The area's unemployment rate stood at 5.3 percent a year ago, five-tenths of a percentage point below the state rate of 5.8 percent. The number of employed workers decreased by 174, with a decrease of 618 in job-seeking residents. The counties driving the unemployment rate decrease are Bell and Coryell, combining for the majority of the unemployment decline. Unemployment historically decreases during the month of December in Central Texas WDA whereas the number employed is variable. Claims for unemployment benefits in the WDA declined over the month by 100.









#### **Coastal Bend WDA**

The Coastal Bend WDA's labor force increased by 182 in December. The unemployment rate dropped three-tenths of a percentage point to 5.0 percent. This rate has remained below 6.0 pecent since June 2005. Coastal Bend WDA's rate stood at 6.4 percent in December of last year, while the state was at 5.8 percent. Coastal Bend's employment increased by 1,010 while the number of unemployed decreased by 828. The counties driving the rate in the WDA are Nueces and San Patricio, accounting for the majority of the employment gains. Claims for unemployment benefits are down by 82 over the month. #### **Concho Valley WDA**

The civilian labor force in the Concho Valley WDA decreased slightly in December to 75,787 people. The labor force is comprised of 73,059 workers and 2,728 job seekers. Concho Valley WDA's unemployment rate decreased three-tenths of a percentage point in December to 3.6 percent. The rate stood at 4.4 percent a year ago. Sutton County had the lowest unemployment rate at 2.4 percent while Concho County had the highest unemployment rate at 6.0 percent. Employment in the WDA edged downward in December by 146 workers and the number of unemployed dropped slightly by 9.0 percent, or 270 people. Six of the twelve counties within the WDA experienced employment losses over the month with the majority of the decline in Tom Green County (123) followed by Mason County (42). All of the twelve counties within the WDA experienced a drop in unemployment over the month with Tom Green County having the largest drop, posting 212 fewer job seekers. The number of continued claims decreased slightly over the month to 274.







Dallas' jobless rate decreased over the month from November's 5.7 percent to 5.2 percent—the lowest rate since May 2001. This decrease was slightly higher than the average reduction of three-tenths of a percentage point that usually occurs between November and December. The number of jobholders rose for a third straight month, climbing by 1,993 to 1,139,503 employed. Since the beginning of the year, the WDA's employment has grown by 35,115 jobholders. The number of Texans in the WDA seeking work decreased over the month, slipping by 5,512 to 62,823 unemployed—its lowest level since May 2001. Continued claims for unemployment insurance decreased for the first time in the past three months, dipping to 14,070 claims.

The HOT WDA's labor force slightly declined over the month by 318. The number of residents seeking work decreased by 479 while the number employed in the workforce increased by 161. 
#### Lower Rio Grande Valley WDA

The civilian labor force in the Lower Rio Grande WDA increased in December to 298,138. The unemployment rate increased by 0.1 percent over the month. The unemployment rate stood at 10.0 percent a year ago. Hidalgo County had the lowest unemployment rate at 6.9 percent while Starr County had the highest unemployment rate at 12.5 percent. Employment in the WDA increased by 2,117 workers in December and the number of unemployed increased by 2.4 percent, or 510 people. Hidalgo County had the largest over-the-month employment gain of 2,260 workers and the largest unemployment gain of 266 more job seekers. All three counties experienced gains in unemployment over the month. Since January 2005, the number of employed has expanded by 12,988. The number of unemployed stood at 29,075 people a year ago. The number of continued claims increased over the month to 6,145. However, since January 2005, claims had dropped by 6,666.



#### Middle Rio Grande WDA

The unemployment rate in the Middle Rio Grande WDA dropped slightly by 0.1 percent in December to 8.0 percent. The rate stood at 10.4 percent a year ago. Year-to-date, the rate has dropped by 3.8 percent. Edwards County and Real County tied with the lowest unemployment rate at 3.8 percent while Maverick County had the highest unemployment rate at 12.5 percent. Employment in the WDA edged upward by 0.6 percent in December to 60,676 workers. Seven of the nine counties had over-the-month employment gains with Zavala County having the largest gain of 190 more workers followed by Val Verde County with 93. Three of the nine counties had decreased unemployment over the month with the largest drop in Val Verde County posting 51 fewer job seekers. The number of employed in the WDA increased slightly since the beginning of the year, with 1,963 added workers. The number of unemployed in the WDA increased by 0.4 percent over the month to 5,311 people. Since January 2005, the number of job seekers in the WDA has declined by 2,537. The number of continued claims increased over the month to 1,614. However, since January 2005, the number of claims had dropped by 1,641.

#### Panhandle WDA

The Panhandle's jobless rate decreased over the month from November's 3.8 percent to 3.5 percent—the lowest rate since December 2000. The number of jobholders nudged upward over the month, increasing by 185 to 206,652 employed. Of the twenty-six counties within the WDA, only eleven counties recorded increases in their employment. The largest employment increase was recorded in Hemphill County with an addition of 133 workers. The number of Texans in the WDA seeking work decreased over the month, sliding by 524 to 7,535 unemployed—its lowest level since May 2001. Of all the counties in the WDA, only Collingsworth and Childress counties had slight increases in their unemployment. The largest decreases to unemployment occurred in Potter County (189) and Randall County (113). 
The civilian labor force in the Permian Basin WDA decreased slightly by 695 in December to 184,489 people. The labor force is comprised of 177,223 workers and 7,266 job seekers. The unemployment rate in the WDA decreased 0.3 percent over the month to 3.9 percent. Borden County had the lowest unemployment rate at 2.3 percent while Reeves County had the highest unemployment rate at 6.7 percent. Employment in the WDA edged downward by 0.1 percent or 166 workers in December. Since January 2005, employment has expanded by 3,602. Of the seventeen counties within the WDA, nine had employment losses over the month. The majority of employment losses occurred in Midland County (118), Ector County (95), and Pecos County (91). The number of unemployed in the WDA declined by 6.8 percent or 529 people over the month. All counties within this WDA experienced either a decrease or no change in job seekers over the month. The number of continued claims dropped slightly over the month to 692 and since the beginning of the year, claims had declined by 2,961.







#### **Rural Capital WDA**

Rural Capital's labor force decreased in size by 2,097 in December. The number of employed residents decreased by 1,184 over the month and the number of job seekers decreased by 913. 
The South Plains' jobless rate decreased over the month from November's 3.9 percent to 3.7 percent—the lowest rate since December 2000. The number of jobholders declined for the second straight month, slipping by 552 to 197,125 employed. The largest employment increase was recorded in Hale County with an addition of 117 workers. The majority of the employment loss within the WDA was attributed to Lubbock County's reduction of 535 employed. #### **Tarrant County WDA**

Tarrant County's jobless rate decreased over the month from November's 5.0 percent to 4.6 percent—the lowest rate since May 2001. This decrease was slightly higher than the average reduction of three-tenths of a percentage point that usually occurs between November and December. The number of jobholders rebounded from November's loss of 571 by adding 2,241 employed in December. Since the beginning of the year, the WDA's employment has grown by 23,896 jobholders. The number of Texans in the WDA seeking work decreased over the month, slipping by 3,367 to 39,001 unemployed—its lowest level since September 2001. Continued claims for unemployment insurance decreased for a second straight month, dipping to 8,162 claims.

#### Texoma WDA

Employment for the Texoma WDA increased by 66 workers in December 2005, which is an increase of one-tenth of a percentage point. Of the three counties, Cooke County had the largest over-the-month increase in employment by adding 122 workers. The number of unemployed workers in the Texoma WDA decreased 5.8 percent and the unemployment rate decreased three-tenths of a percentage point. 
#### **Upper Rio Grande WDA**

The civilian labor force in the Upper Rio Grande WDA decreased slightly in December to 315,685 people. The labor force is comprised of 296,807 workers and 18,878 job seekers. The unemployment rate in the WDA dropped by three-tenths of a percentage point in December to 6.0 percent. Brewster County and Jeff Davis County had the lowest unemployment rate at 2.9 percent while Presidio County had the highest rate at 9.0 percent. Employment in the WDA increased slightly by 99 workers in December while the number of unemployed decreased slightly by 4.9 percent or 971 people. Employment had expanded by 17,629 since the beginning of the year while the number of job seekers declined by 6,750. Of the six counties within the WDA, only Brewster County had a decrease in employment over the month. Four of the six counties had a decrease in job seekers over the month with the majority of the decline being in El Paso County (967). The number of continued claims decreased slightly over the month to 3,592. Since January 2005, the number of continued claims had dropped by 10,569.









#### **West Central Texas WDA**

The West Central's jobless rate decreased over the month from November's 4.1 percent to 3.8 percent—the lowest rate since December 2000. The number of jobholders remained virtually unchanged over the month, holding at 153,991 employed. The largest employment increases were recorded in Coleman County (97), Shackelford County (60), and Stephens County (55). The largest reductions to employment occurred in Taylor County (88) and Nolan County (42). The number of Texans in the WDA seeking work decreased over the month, slipping by 461 to 6,110 unemployed—its lowest level since December 2000. All nineteen counties within the WDA recorded decreases in their unemployment. The majority of the decrease in unemployment for the month was attributed to Taylor County (189), Brown County (42) and Eastland County (39). Continued claims for unemployment insurance decreased for a second straight month, dipping to 645 claims.


